
constraints

insights from Saskatoon:

- Thinking about "governance" is new
- Governance happens in in many different places drawing on many different tools, and subject to various constraints
- Is it good? it could be better!

More support is required for the study of the design principles or grammars of successful governance, particularly outside of and in partnership with government.

It is even more important to fund governance entrepreneurs reinventing governance in communities around the world, and to support ongoing community processes of governance reinvention.
